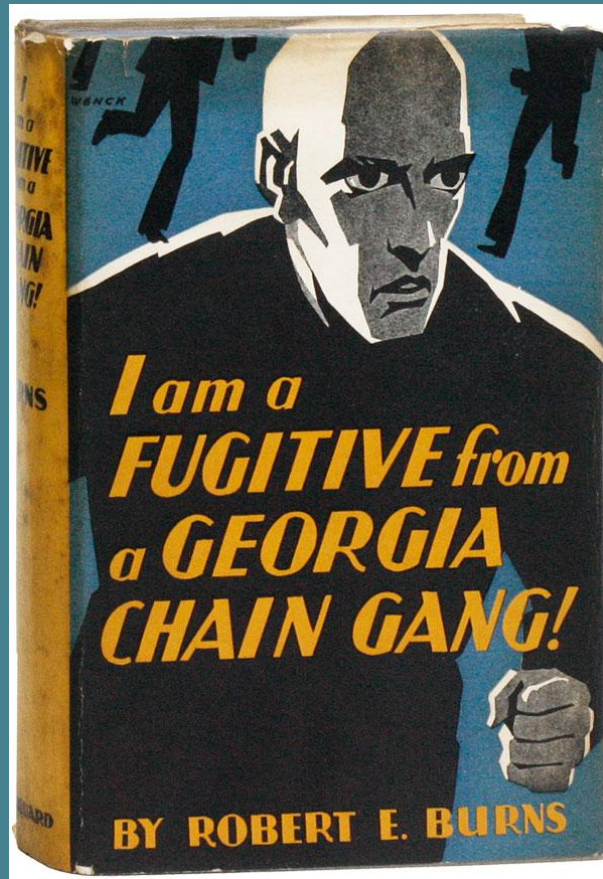
Manchild in the Promised Land - 1965



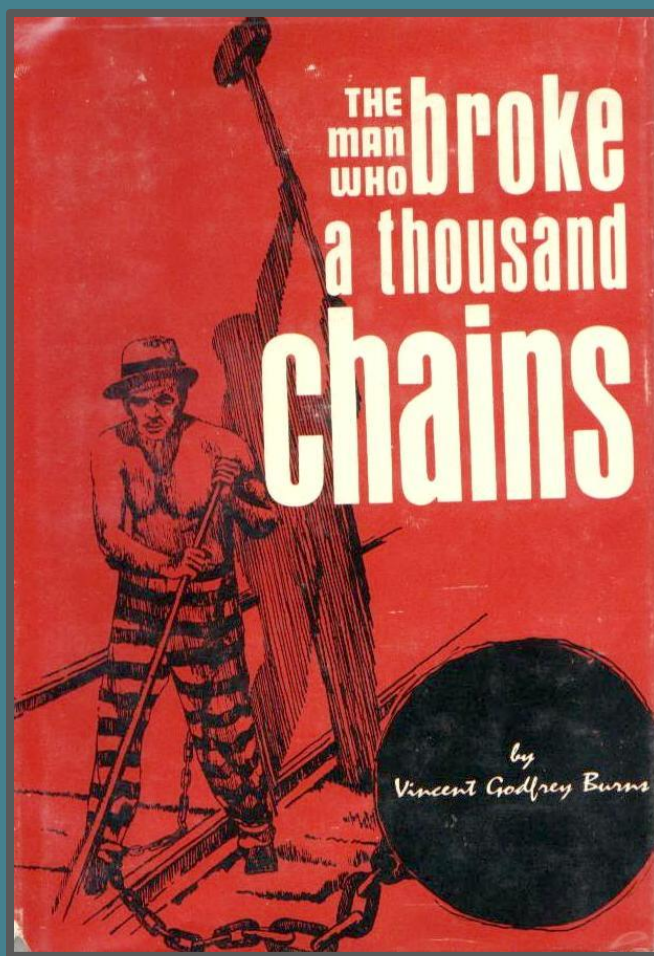
